What is Erasmus+?

- ► Erasmus+ is the EU's programme to support education, training, youth and sport in Europe
- ➤ Opportunities for over 4 million Europeans to study, train, gain experience, and volunteer abroad







What is Erasmus+?



- Set to last until 2020
- Erasmus+ doesn't just have opportunities for students
- Merging seven prior programmes, it has opportunities for a wide variety of individuals and organisations

Key figures: Budget

- **Description** Overall budget: €14.7 billion
 - In addition, € 1.68 billion for funding actions with third countries (partner countries) have been made available through the EU's external action budget.



Key figures: Overall mobility opportunities

- ► More than 4 million people
- ► **Higher Education:** Around 2 million students
- Vocational Education and Training students: Around 650,000 students
- Staff mobility: Around 800,000 lecturers, teachers, trainers, Education staff and Youth workers





Key figures: Overall mobility opportunities

► Volunteer and Youth exchange schemes: More than 500,000 young people

Master's degree loan guarantee scheme: Around 200,000 students

► Joint Master Degrees: More than 25,000 students

Key figures: partnerships and alliances

- ► Strategic Partnerships: Around 25,000 linking together
- ► 125,000 schools, vocational Education and Training institutions, higher and adult Education institutions, Youth organisations and enterprises
- ► Knowledge Alliances: More than 150 set up by 1500 higher Education institutions and enterprises
- Sector Skills Alliances: More than 150 set up by 2000 vocational Education and Training providers and enterprises



Aims

- ► To contribute to the Europe 2020 strategy for growth, jobs, social equity and inclusion
- ► ET2020, the EU's strategic framework for education and training
- ► Also to promote the sustainable development of its partners in the field of higher education




Aims: Specific issues tackled by the programme



- Reducing unemployment, especially among young people
- Promoting adult learning, especially for new skills and skills required by the labour market.
- Encouraging young people to take part in European democracy

Aims: Specific issues tackled by the programme

- Supporting innovation, cooperation and reform
- Reducing early school leaving
- Promoting cooperation and mobility with the EU's partner countries



Students

Studying abroad is a central part of Erasmus+ positive effect on later job prospects.

- ► Improve language skills
- ► Gain self-confidence
- ► Independence and immerse yourself in a new culture



Students opportunities



- Opportunities are available for students at Bachelor, Master or Doctoral levels
- During your period of study abroad: whether this is in an Erasmus+ Programme country or in an Partner country

Studying with traineeship

- Combine studying abroad with a traineeship
- ► Erasmus+ supports traineeships (work placements, internships, etc.) abroad for students enrolled in higher education in a Programme Country
 These opportunities are also open to recent graduates



Erasmus Mundus


- With Joint Master Degrees, you can receive a full degree scholarship
- ► Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degrees are distinguished by their academic excellence and the high level of integration of the courses between multiple higher education institutions across countries
- ► Erasmus+ Master Degree Loans




Young people

- Erasmus+ is open to all young people (17-30)
- With Erasmus+, you can volunteer in Europe or outside of Europe or participate in a youth exchange abroad.
- ► Erasmus+ Volunteering Activities let you travel abroad for a period between 2 weeks and 12 months to participate in a project on a voluntary basis

Youth exchanges

Youth exchanges allow groups of young people from different countries to meet and live together for up to 21 days

On a youth exchange, you can expect to participate in activities such as:

- Exercises
- Debates
- Role-plays
- Outdoor activities, etc.

- Working in a relevant organisation opens up perspectives on your studies
- ▶ Open to people currently in education and recent graduates

Key Action 1: Learning mobility of individuals

- ► Aims to encourage the mobility of students, staff, volunteers, youth workers, and young people
- Organisations can arrange to send or receive students and staff to or from participating countries
 - ► As well as organise teaching, training, learning and volunteering activities

Designed to develop the education, training, and youth sectors through five main activities:

▶ 1: Strategic partnerships to support innovation in the sector as well as joint initiatives to promote cooperation, peer-learning, and the sharing of experience.

partners

- ▶ 2: Knowledge Alliances to foster innovation in and through higher education together with businesses
- Contributing to new approaches to teaching and learning and the modernisation of higher education systems in Europe

- ➤ 3: Sector Skills Alliances to tackle skills gap and ensure a better alignment of vocational education and training with labour market needs
- ► There are opportunities to modernise VET, exchange knowledge and best practices, encourage working abroad, and increase the recognition of qualifications




- ▶ 4: Capacity-building projects in the field of higher education to support the modernisation, accessibility, and internationalisation of higher education in Partner Countries
- ➤ 5: Capacity-building projects in the field of youth to support the development of youth work, non-formal learning, and volunteer work, as well as promote non-formal learning opportunities with Partner Countries

Key Action 3: Support for policy reform

- ▶ Aims to increase the participation of young people in democratic life
- Especially in discussions with policy makers, as well as developing knowledge in the fields of education, training, and youth
